After taking part in UNDP Vietnam's Mock Universal Periodic Review program, she was selected as UNDP Vietnam's Youth Representative to share young people's perspectives on human rights issues in Vietnam at the Consultation Workshop on the Second Draft of Vietnam's Voluntary Mid-term Report on the Implementation of Universal Periodic Review (UPR) Third Cycle Recommendations hosted by Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Vietnam.

Being a Youth Advisor at Plan International Vietnam, she was involved in activities to promote gender equality and girls' rights through conducting research with female leaders from Australia and Indonesia; being taken over by the Swedish Ambassador to Vietnam through the Girl Takeover series; designing training toolkits for ethnic minority youth in Vietnam. She also had the opportunity to participate in other youth-led programs at Embassies and INGOs in Vietnam and partake in regional youth sustainable development forums co-convened by UNDP Asia and the Pacific, UNDP Bangkok Regional Hub, UNICEF East Asia and the Pacific Regional Office, UNICEF Regional Office for South Asia, UNFCCC Regional Collaboration Center - Bangkok.
