

## Ms. Tania Beatriz Bello Regalado, 25, El Salvador



Tania is a young Salvadoran woman who has brought her passion and vocation for the defense of human rights and feminism to a professional field. She began her career in 2017 as a consultant for youth projects at Museo de la Palabra y la Imagen (MUPI) in El Salvador and has created and facilitated training processes for children and adolescents with a culture of peace at the Centro de Desarrollo Humano “Merced para Crecer”.

As a Research Assistant at the organization Cristosal, she collaborated in writing studies on the impact and management of the COVID-19 health crisis and on the situation of LGBTIQ+ youth and persons deprived of liberty in northern Central America. She has experience abroad as a participant in the Teaching Assistant Program in France for the 2020-2021 academic year. She received a degree in International Relations and Business at the Evangelical University of El Salvador (UEES) and has a specialization in Foreign Trade and Customs Management. She is currently completing the postgraduate course “Collective Memories, Human Rights and Resistance” of the Latin American Council of Social Sciences (CLACSO) and the Latin American Faculty of Social Sciences (FLACSO).

In 2017, she was a member of the Museo de la Palabra y la Imagen (MUPI) team, which was awarded the Ibero-American Prize for Human Rights Education “Oscar Arnulfo Romero” by the Organization of Ibero-American States for Education, Science and Culture (OEI). She is one of 20 young Latin American women selected by the Ban ki-Moon Centre for Global Citizens to participate in the Women’s Empowerment Program (WEP), under the instruction of the Vienna School of International Studies.

Tania is now working as Program Assistant for the Central America and Mexico Youth Fund (Camy Fund), a program of the Seattle International Foundation (SIF) that provides financial, technical and political support to youth human rights initiatives, collectives and organizations based in Central America and Mexico. Her native language is Spanish and she holds international certifications in English and French.
